Fifty-Fourth Convention

Would it occur to you to put the words ‘strength’ and ‘gentleness’ together? The recent Convention of Lutheran Women of SA and NT had ‘The Strength of Gentleness’ as our theme, with Philippians 4.5 ‘Let your gentleness be evident to all...The Lord is near” being the theme text.

We thank the women and men of Mid Murray Parish Fellowship and Guilds for their most competent hosting. Even the challenges of a post COVID-19 environment did not deter their enthusiasm and kindness. Flora displays with yellow, white and burgundy accents; a themed banner expressing details of ‘The Strength of Gentleness’; providing morning cuppa along with cake and biscuits; directing parking; setting up the hall and church; and a myriad of other details which were all given thoughtful attention.

Opening Worship was led by Pastor Wally Schiller, currently serving the Mid Murray Parish as locum pastor during its vacancy. Hymns LHS 870 “Lord of all hopefulness”, LHS 783 “Christ is the world’s light” and Song ATE 218 “Spirit” were accompanied by talented guest organist Mr Ken Schuster. The Scriptures read were Psalm 11, Acts 8:26-40 Philip and the Ethiopian and John 15:1-8 Jesus the Vine.



President Grace Kroehn welcomed all present. Convention was honoured with the presence of Deputy Mayor, Mid Murray Council, Simone Bailey; LCA SA-NT District Bishop David Altus; Assistant Bishop for Mission Pastor Stephen Schultz; LWA President Mrs Wendy Habel; Guest Speakers: Mrs Chelsea Pietsch, Pastor Graham Jenke, Bobbie Taylor, Joy Marks; Spot speakers: Mrs Tracy Smith, Pastor Matt Anker and Mrs Julie Krause. Mrs Lorna Bormann spoke as the representative of the Mid Murray Parish organizing committee. There were 218 people in attendance on the day.

Bishop Altus reminded us in his greeting that Gentleness is also part of the upcoming Pastors’ Conference theme, with the words 1 Peter 3:15 reading ‘ . . . Always be prepared to give an answer . . . for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.’

We are invited to pray that gentleness and forbearance are more often displayed. Bishop Altus particularly expressed thanks for the support given to Deaf Ministry. Bishop Altus displays considerable ‘strength in gentleness’ himself and suggested to us 4 actions that can serve others and display gentleness:



Listen to others: this allows people to unburden themselves.

Encouraging: a few simple words of encouragement can be recalled and sustain a person for many years.

Serve: sometimes simply being present with another person when you feel there is nothing else you can do is extremely helpful.

Pray: recalling ‘I can do everything through Christ who strengthens me’.

The offering received for the day amounted to over \$8,900. Of this, 40% will be given to Lutherans for Life, 40% to the Adelaide Deaf Community Church and 20% to Mannum Inter- Church Council (for the work of Pastoral Care Workers).

The Memorial Hymn was played via the video “The Lord’s My Shepherd’ by Stuart Townend.

Lutherans for Life guest speaker Mrs Chelsea Pietsch, a young mother herself and trained lawyer, spoke eloquently and compassionately. Chelsea gave us background into how and why Lutheran’s for Life was established. Its overarching aim is to represent the vulnerable members of society. These include in utero babies and people nearing the end of life. Lutherans for Life affirms the dignity of human life. Chelsea stated that ‘human flourishing is challenged’ in many ways. The Lutherans for Life website has many resources that readers may find beneficial.

Chelsea spoke about the abortion on request bill, which allows abortion up to 22 weeks and 6 days gestation. After that, certain circumstances need to be present to permit abortion. While the bill saddens many, Chelsea said 'positive' outcomes in a negative bill are that aborting based on sex selection is outlawed. There is duty of care to babies born alive if the abortion fails and there is provision for counselling.

Chelsea then addressed the area of end of life. A Bill about euthanasia is currently under discussion [Edit: *This Bill has since passed the SA Parliament*]. We were all encouraged to contact our local member about this. Advocating for quality palliative care is a pro-life action.



LWA President Mrs Wendy Habel distributed her report and advised us that LWA membership is currently 1,960. The *Lutheran Women* magazines will now be posted directly to recipients and there will be a \$1 increase in subscription rate.

LWSA-NT President Mrs Grace Kroehn presented her 'year in review' via a power point of photos of events she attended. Her written report is available in the March 2021 *Tidings Newsletter*. Guilds were reminded to please ensure that all members are able to read a copy of the *Tidings Newsletter*. It is distributed electronically (and in paper form if needed).

LWSA-NT Treasurer Mrs Ruth Kaesler advised that almost \$68,500 has been received for projects in the past financial year. The details of the financial statement are available in the March 2021 *Tidings Newsletter*.

Mrs Tracy Smith spoke about the up-coming 5-day Bus Tour to Horsham to attend the LWA Convention [Edit: *now cancelled due to the cancellation of the Convention*].

Pastor Matt Anker spoke as the representative for LCA International Mission. He thanked the Convention attendees, stating that Lutheran Women are THE biggest supporter of International Mission. While the budget of the department has decreased, the LCA presence in the world has increased. Pastor Matt emphasized how the God of 5 loaves and 2 fish is able to do that. God can multiply our gifts in significant ways. For example, in Burundi a pastor can be trained for \$3,000. There are 1.8 million Lutherans in PNG and 800 members of the LCA have worked in PNG. Other countries where LCA International has a significant presence are Thailand, Malaysia, and Cambodia.



Lunch, which was preceded by the singing of 'Praise God from whom all blessings flow', provided time to catch up with old friends, make new friends and visit the interesting displays provided by Australian Lutheran World Service, Blueprint Ministries, LCA International Mission, Lutheran Archives,

Lutheran Laypeople's League, Lutheran Media, Lutheran Tract Mission, Lutherans for Life, Suicide Prevention, Mannum Good Samaritan Bookshop, Debora Orphanage and Albert Park Sewing Group.

Our afternoon session began with the singing of Hymn LHS 467 "For the Beauty of the Earth".

Pastor Mark Welke, Spiritual Counsellor to LWSA-NT, led a very memorable devotion, where he presented Gentleness as an advertised product. He even had a container of Gentleness on display! We were advised that Gentleness can be applied in the most stubborn of circumstances and that the Gentleness on offer is 'new and improved' because the active ingredient is the Holy Spirit. We were told of the 'unfading beauty of a gentle spirit'. The assembly responded with the singing of song AT 264 "Spirit of God you're with me".



Mr Ken Schuster favoured us with an organ Recital "I'll walk with God".

In the afternoon, guest speaker, Pastor Graham Jenke spoke on the topic of "Suicide Prevention". He explained current terminology, recounted 7 cases of suicide in the Bible and referred us to Job 1 where we are reminded that human life is sacred. He gave us the



statistics relating to death by suicide in Australia compared to other nations. A recommended website is <ruok.org.au>.

Following the singing of "Now thank we all our God" LHS 437, guest speakers Bobbie Taylor and Joy Marks from the Mannum Community College then spoke on the topic "What are the challenges for the youth of today?" We learned that anxiety is common among young people these days. Other frequently encountered difficulties are poor self-regulation of emotions, poor nutrition, sleep and hygiene. We learned that "Seasons for growth" and a phone app called 'Smiling Mind' are good resources. We were advised of the following relatively simple things that we can do that could assist a young person's well-being: smile at them; talk with them; ask about



their lives; introduce yourself; accept their differences; and provide a non-judgemental listening ear. We were strongly encouraged to become involved in the "Mentoring at School" program which involves spending an hour a week with a young person at their school site.

The Retreat Committee advised us that, God willing, there will be a retreat in January 2022.

Lutheran Care advised that cloth bags are most gladly accepted and material can even be provided for individuals to make such bags.



Reports were received from each of the Aged Care facilities, from the National Council of Women and from the World Day of Prayer. Representatives on National Council of Women, World Day of Prayer and Australian Church Women were elected.

The projects for 2021 were approved and the full list is included in this issue of *Tidings Newsletter*.

Julie Krause from ALWS gave a spot talk with visuals about the 'Walk My Way' event which raised funds for refugee children to go to school at the Kakuma Refugee Camp, Kenya.

A moving letter about how a remand centre inmate appreciated the Christmas care package, which includes honey biscuits from Lutheran Women, was shared by in-coming President Josie Hunt.



We were reminded that there are directions regarding Birthing Kit contents are listed on the web-site and please do not deviate from that list.

The 2022 Convention is planned, God willing, to take place at Lobethal Lutheran Church on Thursday 5th May is a suggested date and this will be confirmed later.

Convention concluded with Closing Worship, led by Spiritual Counsellor to LWSA-NT, Pastor Mark Welke. The Executive Committee members were installed and Hymn LHS 514 "Saviour Again" was sung. We thank God for his provision in allowing us to meet for this Convention.

5. The picture of the family, middle right: *gentleness of family.*
6. The cross with the bible, lower right: *the gentleness of the Word and the Lord to us.*
9. The open Bible second from lower right: *the gentleness we get from and through God's word.*
10. **The words in gold symbolise the preciousness of the gift of gentleness set on a white background to symbolise the purity of the giver, Christ.**

Glynde Lutheran Homes Auxiliary

Since the onset of COVID-19 our fundraising has changed from having a Winter Luncheon with a Theme, plus a Spring Fair with various stalls to an alternative. These had proven to be very successful in the past, but now too many obstacles are in the way and we have revised our plans.

We are blessed to have 2 special ladies, Marion Schubert and Petra Williams, affectionately referred to as 'The Plant ladies', who rescue plants from vacated units. They dig, pot, repot, propagate, plant, restore, prune, and present perfectly many, many plants until their back yards are bursting, and so evolved our Plant Sale Days. Table after table are set up on the day from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon and these beautiful plants find a new home. At our most recent day in April we combined it with a Devonshire Morning Tea. The Thrift Shop was also open, giving visitors a lovely morning experience.



Plant sales raised \$1,945.00 and the Devonshire Tea \$475.00 giving a total of \$2,420.00 for the Residential Care Facility [Nursing Home]. A project currently being investigated is the installation of updated sensors which would alert staff to any mishaps and therefore keep residents safe.

The next Plant Sale with Devonshire Morning Tea is Saturday 28th August, then Saturday 27th November with cakes and biscuits (especially honey biscuits). You are all welcome to join us. We are a small group of 7, and blessed to be living in this wonderful place, working and serving together.

Lutheran Care & Clothing Committee

At the June meeting, Babs Deane, Lutheran Care Op Shop manager reported that the Op Shops are doing well.



However, more volunteers are needed so that the shops can remain open for business. Volunteers are also needed to help with sorting clothing and other items at the Blair Athol premises. Non-perishable food donations are to be delivered directly to the front office and

clothing and other items to the northern side door of the shop.

Babs also mentioned that this time of the year plain coloured beanies or berets, headbands and scarves (long ones) are very popular.

The cloth bags for Lutheran Care to use at the Op Shops and Emergency Relief are gratefully received. Suitable material can be obtained from the sorting area at Blair Athol. The ideal size for Op Shop bags is 53 cm (21 in) long x 46 cm (18 in) wide with 46 cm (18 in) length handles sewn on similar to a shopping bag. Emergency relief bags need to be made in a similar size, but from stronger material as food parcels are heavier. Sew the corners to make a box shape at the bottom of the bag. Keep sewing and may God continue to bless your work.



Honey Biscuits

Thank you to all the people who are prepared to make Honey Biscuits. Included with the bags is a series of stickers listing the ingredients. These need to be stuck onto the bags. The Honey Biscuits can be iced, or you can make them special with long sprinkles, choc bits, cherries, etc. Please do **NOT** use hard cachous, 100's and 1,000's, or toppings that can get stuck between teeth, or under mouth plates. **Please NO NUTS.**



Pack 125 grams [4 oz.] of biscuits into each bag. Close the bag with curling ribbon, and you may attach a Christmas tract/small card, telling the recipient which Fellowship has prepared the packet. This year, the completed Honey Biscuit packets can be left at either
