PRAYER IDEAS

Hand out small slips of paper and pencils for people to write down names of people needing prayer or the actual prayer request on their behalf. Collect them in a bowl and offer them up on the altar as a visual sign of praying for others.

We can serve one another by praying for them. This is called intercessory prayer. You can use **Ephesians 6:18** or **1 Timothy 2:1-3** as you explain to the congregation how you are going to pray today.
