## Standard procedures and questions in colloquizing prospective church servants

Adopted by the Commission on Theology and Inter-Church Relations, May 1974.

- 1. In accordance with the By-laws of the LCA (V.A. 'Reception into the Ministry and Assignment')
  - (1) the committee of colloquy appointed by the President of the Church shall consist of not less than three pastors, and
  - (2) the person colloquized shall before entering the ministry of the Church be required to sign a declaration in which he accepts the Constitution and By-Laws of the Church.
- 2. It is recommended that, prior to the colloquy, prospective Church servants be asked:
  - (1) to familiarize themselves with the background of the LCA, at least in broad outline, and with the present structure of the Church;
  - (2) to acquaint themselves with the Theses of Agreement, and any subsequent statements adopted by the Church;

and that the relevant literature and/or literature references be supplied for the above purposes where requested.

- 3. In conducting the colloquy itself it is recommended that at least the following areas of doctrine be covered, or at least touched on:
  - (1) the person and work of Christ;
  - (2) justification and its relationship to sanctification;
  - (3) the inspiration and authority of Scripture;
  - (4) the status and the content of the historic Lutheran Confessions;
  - (5) the ministry of the Church;
  - (6) the mission of the Church the 'Two Kingdoms' doctrine;

## STANDARD PROCEDURES AND QUESTIONS IN COLLOQUISING PROSPECTIVE CHURCH SERVANTS

- (7) the Sacraments;
- (8) the worship of the Church and its liturgy.

**Note:** These principles may also be applied as guidelines for the colloquizing of those whose service in the Church directly involves the public teaching of the Church.
