Hello All,

Somehow I am already four months into my home assignment! While I have sent out a text-only prayer update in that time, this is my first newsletter since November last year. While I am home assignment my updates will be less frequent.

When I arrived in Australia I purchased a campervan to use as both transport and accommodation for this year. While I have been in Adelaide for nearly two months and house sitting for friends, it has been mostly transport. As I get ready to be on the road again, taking two weeks to get from Adelaide to Melbourne and then another two weeks from Melbourne to Brisbane, it will once again be my home on wheels. I am enjoying that is gives me the flexibility to explore Australia's national parks as I travel and to carry a few more things with me. I have taken to referring to it as the turtle, as it is my turtle shell home, to meander Australia in this year.

My two months in Adelaide have been good. It is now more than thirteen years since I lived in Adelaide, so it has been encouraging to find that many friendships still connect well, even though we have all changed over that time. I have enjoyed sharing at a number of churches and events about my part in what God has been doing in translation, Scripture use and vernacular literacy in the Gulf Province in PNG. I have also been to arts events, got back in the pool, gone for beach and bush walks, and enjoyed going slowly. One feature of my time in Adelaide has been appointments with a physio who has done specialised training in headache treatment. As a result, my chronic headaches are doing much better. They are not completely gone, but they are hugely improved, and I am very thankful for that.

News from PNG has mostly been encouraging. The fifth Oral Bible Storytelling (OBS) workshop went well, and while PNG has had challenges sourcing sufficient aviation fuel the sixth and final OBS workshop in June should still happen. What is unlikely to happen is the Vernacular Creative Phonics (VCP) course, as we do not have a staff member available to host the course. This is disappointing, as there is significant local interest in learning to teach literacy in their local languages, but it is looking like we will have to cancel the course.

It is good being back in Australia and largely having a break from the stresses of PNG, and it is good to have chances to share with people about what God has been doing in the delta area of Gulf Province in PNG.
