Profile of Additional Member for Lutheran Women SA-NT Executive

My name is Debbie Borgas (nee Clarke) and I am 59 years old. I am married to Michael and have 1 adult son.

I am blessed to have known God's never-ending love for me my whole life. I was born into a Christian family, which modelled celebrating God's love for us through weekly church attendance and active involvement in our congregation.

I am a member of the Ebenezer/Neukirch Ladies Fellowship. For the past 29 years I have been a member of the Neukirch congregation which we joined when we moved to the Barossa Valley following 2 years teaching in PNG with Wycliffe Bible Translators.

Two years ago I retired from being a Lutheran School teacher, having taught mainly kindergarten and Junior Primary classes during my career.

Aside from our time in the Barossa, I have been a member of congregations in Birdwood, where I was baptized, Hampstead Adelaide, where I was confirmed; Murray Bridge, where we were married in 1985; and Nhill, Victoria. I have been a Sunday School teacher since I was confirmed as a teenager. I have been on a team presenting the Christian faith to local state schools and I have served on the state



committee for Children's ministry for a time. I am very familiar with visiting at Lutheran Homes, as my parents and in-laws spent a total of 14 years residing there.

Currently I am a pastoral assistant in my congregation; the Parish Council rep; Sunday School teacher; and Fellowship member. I am a volunteer visitor with the Community Visitors Scheme.

I appreciate the way Guild meetings give Christian women the opportunity to share their faith insights, particularly in Bible Study. I deeply admire and appreciate the numerous projects Lutheran Women generously support. I am hopeful that in the future we can find ways to encourage women who are younger to want to join Guild Fellowships.

Convention Report

The 53rd Convention of Lutheran Women of SA-NT met at Para Vista on Saturday 18th May 2019, with the theme "Radiant with Hope." This theme was chosen as a follow-up to the 2018 LWA Convention theme "Faith, Freedom, Future – Hope".

After voices rang out with the opening hymn – *Praise to the Lord* – Pastor Rolly Stahl read the theme text from Romans 15:13, encouraging all present to live with hope because of Jesus. Using a teapot as an illustration, he explained that our faith can be like infused tea. Just as tea leaves change with hot water, so the gift of hope begins with our baptism, and joins us to Jesus. He began his afternoon devotion by talking about Radiance and Hope, encouraging us to share the light and love of Jesus. Jesus wants us to bring hope and healing to those in despair. This can be done by just simply listening and seeking to understand how things are in their world. Not being alone in a struggle renews hope!

The 200 people in attendance were welcomed by Ragna Gaard, President of Good Shepherd Women's Fellowship Para Vista, whose members ably cared for all in their duty as hosts. Frances Bedford, local independent MP, spoke of ways to keep hope alive in the community and she recognised the work undertaken at Para Vista and in all of our local communities.

District Bishop David Altus greeted the gathering, reminding us that Hope is given to us by God and nothing that happens to us can take that away. Things in life do not last for ever, there is a season and time for everything. We have hope in someone who lived a perfect life. Do not lose hope, do not lose heart there are wonderful things that God is doing!

Tessa Joppich and Andrea Konigsmann spoke passionately about the work that Lutheran Community Care (LCC) does with and for foster children and their families. LCC wants its work to be exceptional and different when meeting the needs of these vulnerable children and families. There is a lot of prayer involved! Growing from just an idea ten years ago, there are now 180 foster families and 240 children under their care.

Pastor Richard Fox, Director of Lutheran Media, shared how a message of hope travels across the airwaves, reaching people whose lives are devoid of hope. Through the many and varied media forms, funded by generous donations, it is heartening to know how people are rescued when all in their life appears to be lost.

LCC Foster Care and Lutheran Media will be the beneficiaries of the offerings at Convention. Additional monies received since convention, have made for a total of just over \$11,300.00.

Various spot speakers shared news and needs. Joan Koster, who co-ordinates the shipping of Birthing Kits to Papua New Guinea, asked for all kits to be complete when sent in. Should people have a surplus of some of the required items, please contact Joan and she may be able to put you in touch with someone who has need for these items. Nevin Nitschke of LCA Mission International, came to us as the programmed speaker Peter Nitschke (Stamps for Missions) was unable to attend. Nevin shared how the sale of the many postage stamps, dutifully cleaned by many of the women present, generates funds for ongoing mission work in New Guinea. Andrew Waldhuter of Lutheran Laypeople's League (LLL), encouraged us to use its services, in turn generating funds to assist in giving hope in the wider work of our church.

Singing on occasions such as convention, is always uplifting and encouraging and we were favoured with a number of delightful songs performed by Elsa, Josephine and Gretta, daughters of one of the pastors at Para Vista, Pastor Reid Matthias.

Let us be Radiant with Hope during this coming year, sharing the Hope we have in Jesus, as we travel on the year's journey, coming together next on Thursday, 7th May 2020, at St Martin's Lutheran Church, Mannum.

South East Zone Women's Retreat

Tarooki Uniting



Church Campsite was the venue for the SE Zone Lutheran Women's Retreat on the weekend of 22nd to 24th February 2019. A total of 22 full time retreaters and 11 Saturday retreaters came for rest, Christian fellowship and Bible study with the theme of 'Be still and know that I am God', Psalm 46:10. Retreat spiritual leader, Pastor Greg Vangness had prepared an interesting format which encouraged retreaters to think about being still, knowing God and explored how we think. In a circle divided into Christian meditation by types, most retreaters went to the service (head) area, while other smaller groups were in the knowledge (head) area, and in the mysticism and praise areas of the heart half. In the second session for bible study, retreaters wrote down times where they were aware of God's involvement in their life, and later were able to share this in groups of 2 or 3.

Zoe Fisher set up prayer stations for Saturday evening's session. We visited each station silently exploring, reflecting and being still in God's presence. It was refreshing to feel water being poured into my hands, smell different scents, taste different flavours, look into mirrors which reflected the sky, and my own reflection, quietly using scrabble letters to fill a board with names describing God, and a grid of sticks which we were asked to decorate with coloured and textured wools.

The Saturday began with a Holy Communion service in the beautiful chapel at Tarooki, a change from recent years where the service was held on Saturday evening. Sunday morning worship was led by Pastor Greg with singing and a bible study on Noah. We learnt that he retreated with God while on the ark during the flood. Noah built an altar to worship God after the flood. Pastor Greg encouraged us to have a special place set aside in our homes for worship, meditation, home devotions.

Supplies from the Bordertown Bookshop gave an opportunity to browse for Christian books, cards, cups, DVD's etc.

The planning committee introduced new trends – the Saturday morning worship instead of Saturday evening and trialled Pizzas on Friday night and Saturday lunch catered by Tarooki camp. A new evaluation form has given some insight into retreaters' opinions and indication for planning next year's retreat.

Free time was popular with women enjoying the time for rest, meditation, walking along Robe's coast and creeks and time to chat with other Christian women.

The planning committee elected for 2020 retreat is Leader: Alicia Graham; Secretary: Lynette Lauterbach, and extra members: Sue Thompson (Mt Gambier), Judy Fisher (Keith) and Shelley Koch (Naracoorte).

"My mum died and I'm so sad and lonely"



Anthony's mum died and he spiralled into depression, anxiety, grief and guilt. He was lost and didn't know where to go to

find help and how to escape what he was going through.

This is when Anthony heard your Messages of Hope on his radio. Because of your generosity, prayers, and kindness, sons and daughters like Anthony can hear the good news of Jesus Christ and his message of hope.

Anthony shared his story of his loving relationship with his mum. He shared how he was heartbroken and had no one to turn to. He was anxious and depressed, suffering from grief and guilt, and didn't think he would be able to survive.

We shared with him how he is loved by Jesus. That Jesus is with him and that he can cry to him as he has promised to listen. We prayed for Anthony and asked if he knew the location of his local church. He did and was encouraged to visit and meet the people.

Because of you, we could also offer Anthony some booklets on anxiety, depression, forgiveness and grief.

Anthony now listens to your Messages of Hope every chance he can get. He relies on it to get through the day. Because of you, Messages of Hope are giving him and many others hope in Jesus Christ.

Your Messages of Hope are reaching out to people throughout Southern India and Asia.

At a Christian Media conference, I heard that your Messages of Hope are on even more radio stations. Radio stations around the world are downloading and sharing the radio messages, including in southern India and Asia. From the people I met at the conference, your Messages of Hope is on more than 900 radio stations and probably over 1,000. Your Messages of Hope are also now being played on SEN in Adelaide and Melbourne. SEN broadcasts the AFL and cricket.

Lutheran Nurses of Australia

The Lutheran Nurses Association of Australia (LNAA) has established a Lutheran Nurse of the Year award. The recipient will be announced each year on International Nurses Day (12th May), beginning next year.

The award recognises faithful and outstanding service during the preceding calendar year by a nurse who is an active member of a Lutheran congregation in Australia or New Zealand. It comprises a certificate and a \$100 monetary gift.

Nominations may be submitted by congregations, aged-care facilities or other bodies or agencies within the Lutheran church. *(A nomination sheet is included with this edition of the Tidings.)*

Nominations for the first award must be lodged with the LNAA secretary on the official nomination form by 31st March 2020, together a separate sheet giving details of the service that forms the basis of the nomination, and references from three people, including the congregation's pastor.

International Nurses Day is celebrated around the world on the anniversary of Florence Nightingale's birthday. Next year will be the 200th anniversary of her birth. The World Health Organization Executive Board, through its Director-General, Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, has recommended to the World Health Assembly meeting in May that 2020 be designated as the Year of the Nurse and Midwife.
