## Spiritual Life at Convention

#### 1. Convention theme - Come, listen, live

The Convention of General Synod theme is based on Isaiah 55:3 '...come to me, listen, that you may live.'

**COME** – come to Jesus and there you will see how much God loves you and how much he paid to redeem you. His cross is your beginning and your end. Everything in your life and death is anchored and finds its meaning there. Here is where you come to be reborn – to repent, to lay down your burdens. Here you receive new life – forgiveness, renewal and refreshment.

**LISTEN** – pause at the cross, be still, hear the timeless God speak to you from the cross. Hear his voice in the crosses of your own life and in the life of the church. Lay aside the load you carry, all the voices demanding your attention, even those of your own making. Here at the cross, listen to God and you will receive everything you need ...

... that you may **LIVE**. Life truly comes when we live through the cross of Christ, in the power of his death, resurrection and ascension. Jesus is where God meets us on earth, and we know abundant life in him, life marked by the fruits of the Spirit and life eternal with him forever.

#### 2. Logo explanation

The cross is central and prominent. Lutheran teaching always points to and revolves Jesus. Our teaching is interpreted by his cross. It's the lens through which we view the world. The cross shapes our relationships with God and with others.

The circle represents a how all creation finds its centre and its purpose in Jesus.

The background landscape mosaic places the cross in the context of the world in which we live, and our place and purpose in it.

The text (come, listen, live) is embedded around the cross, circling it in a continuous, neverending movement. The invitation of God to come, listen and live at the foot of the cross is a lifetime calling.

#### 3. Synod Offering

The 2021 Synod offering of \$19,097.60 was received for the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea, a partner church of the LCANZ. The offering will support in-service training of pastors in the ELCPNG so that they may be strengthened in their ministry of the gospel.

2-13 New and amended definitions: Lutheran Church of Australia Inc (agenda 2.1.6.1)

**20–12 RESOLVED that Article 1 NAME AND INTERPRETATION** of the Constitution of the Church be amended to add and reorganise clauses as follows (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

#### ARTICLE 1. NAME AND INTERPRETATION

- 1.1 The name of this Church is LUTHERAN CHURCH OF AUSTRALIA INC., hereinafter called 'the Church'.
- 1.2 In this Constitution and the By-laws made there under, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
  - 1.2.1 **'Act'** means the Associations Incorporation Act 1985 (SA) as amended from time to time and includes any replacement of that Act or any provisions substituted for, and all regulations and statutory instruments issued under, that Act.
  - 1.2.2 'auditor' means a person having appropriate qualifications to examine and verify financial accounts and records in accordance with legal requirements and the audit policy of the Church;
  - 1.2.3 'Church' means the Lutheran Church of Australia Incorporated;
  - 1.2.14 **'church worker'** means any person whose name is listed on the Register of Church Workers provided for in the By-laws of the Church;
  - 1.2.25 'congregation' means a group of persons adhering to the Lutheran Faith who regularly meet for the administration of the Means of Grace and who have constituted themselves as an organised body by the adoption of a constitution;
  - 1.2.6 'District' means a prescribed geographical area or other sector established by the Church to further the Objects of the Church;
  - 1.2.37 **'Evangelical Lutheran Church'** is-means a generic reference to churches throughout the world which proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ as understood and confessed in the Book of Concord of 1580;
  - 1.2.8 'General Church Board' means the voting members of the Church elected to administer the affairs of the Church;
  - 1.2.-9 **'lay member'** means any member of a congregation of the Church other than a pastor;
  - 1.2.510 'parish' means a congregation or a group of congregations forming an entity which is served by one or more pastors;

- 1.2.611 'pastor' or 'member of the Ministry' means any person ordained to the Holy Ministry according to the rites and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church who has been received into the Ministry of the Church according to Article 5.1;
- 1.2.12 'special resolution' means a resolution that is passed, after due notice has been given to all voting members and processed in accordance with the requirements of a special resolution, and which has been declared as having been passed as a special resolution;
- 1.2.713 'teacher' means any pastor or lay member called or appointed by the Church or by any of its Districts or congregations to serve on the teaching staff of a school or educational institution established and maintained by the Church or District or congregation;
- 1.2.14 'Zone' means a prescribed geographical area or other sector within a District of the Church; and
- 1.2.8 'the Act' means the Associations Incorporation Act 1985 (SA) as amended from time to time and includes any replacement of that Act or any provisions substituted for, and all regulations and statutory instruments issued under, that Act: and
- 1.2.**915** words importing the singular number shall be deemed to include the plural number.

- 1.1 The name of the District is LUTHERAN CHURCH OF AUSTRALIA, ............... DISTRICT<sub>7</sub>
  hereinafter called 'the District'.
- 1.2 In this Constitution and the By-laws made thereunder, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

  - 1.2.2 'auditor' means a person having appropriate qualifications to examine and verify financial accounts and records in accordance with legal requirements and the audit policy of the Church;
  - 1.2.**13 'Church**' means the Lutheran Church of Australia Incorporated;
  - 1.2.24 **'church worker'** means any person within the District whose name is listed on the Register of Church Workers provided for in the By-laws of the Church;
  - 1.2.35 'congregation' means a group of persons within the assigned area of the District adhering to the Lutheran Faith who regularly meet for the administration of the Means of Grace and who have constituted themselves as an organised body by the adoption of a constitution;
  - 1.2.6 'District' means the Lutheran Church of Australia . . . . . . . District;
  - 1.2.47 **'Evangelical Lutheran Church'** is-means a generic reference to churches throughout the world which proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ as understood and confessed in the Book of Concord of 1580;
  - 1.2.8 'financial year' means the year ending 31 December;
  - 1.2.9 'District Church Council' means the voting members of the District elected to administer the affairs of the District;
  - 1.2.**510 'lay member**' means any member of a congregation of the District other than a pastor;
  - 1.2.**611 'parish'** means a congregation or a group of congregations forming an entity which is served by one or more pastors;
  - 1.2.712 'pastor' or 'member of the Ministry' means any person ordained to the Holy Ministry according to the rites and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church who has been received into the Ministry of the Church according to Article 5.1;
  - 1.2.13 'special resolution' means a resolution that is passed, after due notice has been given to all voting members and processed in accordance with the requirements of a special resolution, and which has been declared as having been passed as a special resolution;
  - 1.2.814 'teacher' means any pastor or lay member called or appointed by the District or any of its congregations to serve on the teaching staff of a school or

- educational institution established and maintained by the District or congregation;
- 1.2.15 'Zone' means a prescribed geographical area or other sector within the District:
- 1.2.<del>10</del>16 words importing the singular number shall be deemed to include the plural number.

#### 2-15 Not-for-Profit clause: Lutheran Church of Australia Inc. (agenda 2.1.6.3)

**20–14 RESOLVED that ARTICLE 3. OBJECTS** of the Constitution of the Church be amended to add the following clause (words to be added - **bold**):

**ARTICLE 3. OBJECTS** 

#### 3.2 Not-for-Profit

- 3.2.1 The property and income of the Church shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects or purposes of the Church and no part of that property or income may be paid or otherwise distributed, directly or indirectly, to members of the Church, except in good faith in the promotion of those objects or purposes.
- 3.2.2 A payment may be made to a member out of the funds of the Church only if it is authorised under the following clause 3.2.3.
- 3.2.3 A payment to a member out of the funds of the Church is authorised if it is
  3.2.3.1 payment in good faith to the member as reasonable remuneration for any services provided to the Church, or for goods supplied to the Church, in the ordinary course of business; or
  - 3.2.3.2 payment of interest, on money borrowed by the Church from the member, at a rate not greater than the cash rate published from time to time by the Reserve Bank of Australia; or
  - 3.2.3.3 payment of reasonable rent to the member for premises leased by the member to the Church; or
  - 3.2.3.4 reimbursement of reasonable expenses properly incurred by the member on behalf of the Church; or
  - 3.2.3.5 making a payment or providing a benefit to a member in carrying out the objects of the Church for charitable purposes.

#### 2–16 Not-for-Profit clause: Model Constitution of Districts (2.1.6.4)

**20–15 RESOLVED that ARTICLE 3. OBJECTS** of the By-laws of the Church, Constitution of the Districts, be amended to add the following clause (words to be added - **bold**):

ARTICLE 3. OBJECTS

#### 3.2 Not-for-Profit

- 3.2.1 The property and income of the District shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects or purposes of the District and the Church and no part of that property or income may be paid or otherwise distributed, directly or indirectly, to members of the District of the Church, except in good faith in the promotion of those objects or purposes.
- 3.2.2 A payment may be made to a member out of the funds of the District only if it is authorised under the following clause 3.2.3.
- 3.2.3 A payment to a member out of the funds of the District is authorised if it is 3.2.3.1 payment in good faith to the member as reasonable remuneration for any services provided to the District, or for goods supplied to the District, in the ordinary course of business; or
  - 3.2.3.2 payment of interest, on money borrowed by the District from the member, at a rate not greater than the cash rate published from time to time by the Reserve Bank of Australia; or
  - 3.2.3.3 payment of reasonable rent to the member for premises leased by the member to the District: or
  - 3.2.3.4 reimbursement of reasonable expenses properly incurred by the member on behalf of the District; or
  - 3.2.3.5 making a payment or providing a benefit to a member in carrying out the objects of the District for charitable purposes.

#### 2–17 Definition of Delegates to General Synod (agenda 2.1.6.5)

**20–16 RESOLVED that ARTICLE 7. THE GENERAL SYNOD** of the Constitution of the Church be amended to add the following words (words to be added – **bold**):

### ARTICLE 7. THE GENERAL SYNOD

- 7.2 The General Synod shall consist of
  - 7.2.1 lay delegates of the congregations;
  - 7.2.2 pastor delegates;
  - 7.2.3 the members of the General Church Board;
  - 7.2.4 chairpersons of boards **and councils** unless already eligible under 7.2.1, 7.2.2, or 7.2.3;
  - 7.2.5 all Bishops unless already eligible under 7.2.2, or 7.2.3;
  - one [1] secondary and one [1] primary school principal elected from each region of Lutheran Education Australia by the principals of that region;
  - 7.2.7 past Bishops of the Church; and
  - 7.2.8 three [3] pastors emeriti nominated by the General Church Board who shall comprise the voting members.

### 2–18 Dissolution clause: Lutheran Church of Australia Inc. (agenda 2.1.6.6)

**20–17 RESOLVED that ARTICLE 11. DISSOLUTION** of the Constitution of the Church be amended to add the following words (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

#### ARTICLE 11. DISSOLUTION

- Any resolution for dissolution or amalgamation shall be made Any motion for dissolution or amalgamation shall be resolved by a special resolution and shall be made according to the following procedure:
  - 11.1.1 **Written An**otice of a motion specifying such action shall be given to the delegates of the General Synod.
  - 11.1.2 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a General Synod, specifying such action as a special motion, shall be given to the delegates of the General Synod.
  - 11.1.3 The motion must be presented at a duly constituted General Synod and shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the registered delegates of the General Synod.

## Appendix 1

## Constitution of Australian Lutheran World Service

Australian Business Number (ABN) 36 660 551 871 Other Unincorporated Entity An Agency of the Lutheran Church of Australia Inc (ABN 36 763 133 867)

#### 1. NAME

The name of the organisation is Australian Lutheran World Service (ALWS).

#### 2. RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH

ALWS is an agency of the Lutheran Church of Australia Inc (the Church) and shall fulfil its responsibilities in keeping with the Constitution and the policies of the Church.

### 3. PURPOSE

ALWS shall serve as the overseas humanitarian aid and development agency of the Church, translating the spirit of Christian love and faith of the Church into effective services with and for those most in need.

#### 4. OBJECTS

The objects of ALWS are to:

- 4.1. provide life-sustaining care to those who suffer most from poverty and injustice in developing countries, empowering them to create more just and sustainable communities, through emergency relief and long-term development programs;
- 4.2. welcome and bring love to life for those fleeing from or affected by disaster, poverty and oppression, building strength and resilience for the future, through partnerships with organisations sharing the same purpose;
- 4.3. inspire the Lutheran family of Australia and New Zealand, and the wider community generally, to take action to help people hurt by poverty and injustice around the world, and to equip them to do it effectively;
- 4.4. work alongside local churches and partner organisations in the developing world to strengthen capacities to transform lives and the unjust structures that perpetuate poverty;
- 4.5. build alliances with organisations around the world, jointly mobilising resources to address poverty and crisis, and seek lasting solutions to injustice.

### 5. POWERS AND AUTHORITY

- 5.1. The Board of ALWS has all the lawful capacities and powers, to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the objects of the organisation.
- 5.2. The Church shall have the power to assume and exercise full control of all funds and assets of ALWS, provided that:
  - 5.2.1. a resolution to this effect shall have been adopted by the General Synod of the Church at any time of its regular or special conventions; and
  - 5.2.2. such control shall be exercised subject to the purposes and conditions under which such funds or assets were acquired.
- 5.3. The management of the affairs of ALWS shall be vested in a Board which is appointed by the General Church Board (GCB) of the Church.
- 5.4. The policies of the Church shall guide the work of ALWS in regard to:
  - 5.4.1. governance responsibilities, including compliance with the policies of the Church on Conflict of Interest and Review Processes; and
  - 5.4.2. functioning and decision-making.

#### 6. INCOME AND PROPERTY

- 6.1. The income and property of the organisation, including those held in trust for the organisation, will be applied towards the sole promotion of the objects of ALWS as set-out in Clause 4.
- 6.2. No income or property of ALWS will be paid or transferred directly or indirectly to any individual except as genuine compensation for services rendered or expenses incurred on behalf of the organisation in its ordinary course of business.

### 7. BOARD MEMBERSHIP

- 7.1. The Board shall consist of not less than five [5] nor more than seven [7] members.
- 7.2. The Board shall consist of people with a passion for overseas aid and development and the relevant skills, qualifications and experience to govern ALWS from a cross-section of the districts of the Church.
- 7.3. The membership of the Board shall consist of the following appointed by the GCB:
  - 7.3.1. a chairperson who shall be a voting member of a congregation of the Church;
  - 7.3.2. one pastor on the Roll of Pastors of the Church;
  - 7.3.3. at least one member with knowledge and experience in the aid and development sector; and
  - 7.3.4. two [2] to four [4] members reflecting a diverse range of backgrounds and competencies to enable the objects to be fulfilled.
- 7.4. The Executive Officer (EO) shall attend all board meetings as a consultant.
- 7.5. All members of the Board must uphold the teachings and values of the Church, with a majority of members being Lutheran and the balance shall be practising members of another recognised denomination of the Christian faith.
- 7.6. Tenure of Board members shall be a minimum of one [1] term of three [3] years and a maximum of three [3] terms with the possibility of an extension to a fourth term in exceptional circumstances.
- 7.7. The Board, in consultation with the EO, may invite others to attend meetings.
- 7.8. The Board has the power to form sub-committees if necessary.
- 7.9. The Board may appoint a Board Advisory Group to provide advice and recommendations on areas of expertise.

#### 8. MEETING ARRANGEMENTS AND REPORTING

- 8.1. Meetings shall be convened by the Chairperson.
- 8.2. The Board shall meet at least twice per year face-to-face. Additional meetings are at the discretion of the Board and may be convened face-to-face, by electronic means, or by other means of communication.
- 8.3. A majority of members of the Board shall constitute quorum at any meeting.
- 8.4. Email correspondence may be used for the distribution of minutes, advisory information or approval of documentation.
- 8.5. The minutes of the Board meetings shall be submitted to the GCB.

### 9. RESPONSIBILITIES

The Board shall

- 9.1. appoint an Executive Officer (EO), in consultation with the GCB, who shall be responsible to the Board for overall conduct of the organisation, its staff and management of funds under its control;
- 9.2. provide good governance and oversight of the fiduciary aspects of ALWS, including compliance with funding and regulatory bodies, and ensuring continuity of accreditation;
- 9.3. approve all policies relating to governance, internal compliance and control, codes of conduct and legal compliance as mandated by the Australian Government;
- 9.4. ensure overall readiness for accreditation by the Australian Government;

- 9.5. set the strategic direction of the organisation in alignment with that of the Church and approve appropriate strategic and operational plans;
- 9.6. receive, review and approve periodic reports from the EO, including audited financial statements, financial reports, strategic and operational performance reports, and risk analysis reports;
- 9.7. nominate an independent auditor for approval by the Church for a three-year term;
- 9.8. maintain strong relationships with the Church and its entities, particularly with church congregations and Lutheran schools; and
- 9.9. conduct inductions for new members and periodic reviews of board performance, to provide a pathway to optimal governance effectiveness.

#### 10. FINANCIAL YEAR

The financial year shall be 1 January to 31 December.

#### 11. CONTRACTS

The GCB delegates to the Board the authority to enter into contracts on behalf of the Church in the pursuit of its objects.

#### 12. RECORD KEEPING

The Board shall

- 12.1. maintain financial records of ALWS that
  - 12.1.1. correctly record and explain the transactions, financial position and performance; and
  - 12.1.2. enable true and fair financial statements to be prepared and audited;
- 12.2. keep written records that correctly represent its operations and enable them to be produces when required by law;
- 12.3. retain its records for at least seven years, or as otherwise required by the ACNC Act or any other laws that may apply; and
- 12.4. take reasonable steps to ensure that the records are kept safe.

#### 13. WINDING UP

- 13.1. In the event of ALWS being wound up or it ceasing to be endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient, any surplus assets remaining after the payment of liabilities of the organisation shall be transferred to another approved not-for-profit organisation that is an eligible organisation for the purposes of operating as an Overseas Aid Fund under Item 9.1.1 of the table set out in Section 30-80(1) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- 13.2. In making distributions upon winding up, the Board must satisfy any obligations to the fullest extent possible that apply to assets over which a trust exists.
