Metropolitan South Zone Fellowship Day

The Bethlehem Sanctuary Guild and Bethlehem Women's Guild hosted the LWSA-NT Metropolitan South Zone Fellowship Day on Thursday 1st June 2023. Some fifty-six attended, meeting under the theme of 'God's promises are Ageless' (Isaiah 46:3b-4). God says: "I have created you and cared for you since you were born. I will be your God through all your lifetime, yes, even when your hair is white with age. I made you and I will care for you. I will carry you along and be your Saviour."

Morning Tea and Registration were held in the Stables. The morning program began in the church with Judith Ortlepp, Sanctuary Guild



President, welcoming all and noting that the day also marked the 130th Anniversary of the Bethlehem Women's Guild. Pastor Stephen Pietsch led the Opening Devotion based on Isaiah 46:1-4.

Pastor explored the question "Who is carrying whom?" Like the people of Israel we too have false idols (reputation, money, possessions) that we think will carry us through life and on which we can rely. But idols, no matter how promising or permanent and reliable they look, are all the same. In the end they don't carry you, you have

to carry them. God lovingly reassures that it is 'I who will carry you, who has always carried you, even when you turned your face away from me.' Through every stage of life, from before we are born until after our life here in this world ends, those eternal hands carry us, bearing us to himself and the glory he has been preparing for us. This is the God who created (made) each one of us, who will carry us, who will save us through his Son Jesus Christ, the one who literally carried our burden on his shoulders and bore our sins on the cross through death to life. The morning hymns were 377 'Take my life and let it be' and 855 'Brother let me be your servant' with Dorothy Zweck as the organist.

Helen Hassold, Vice-President of the Sanctuary Guild, introduced Dr Tania Nelson the

keynote speaker for the morning program on the topic of 'Growing Older in the 21st Century'. Dr Nelson is the Executive



Officer for Local Mission of the LCA and Director of Care Ministries. She began her presentation with a look at 'now and then, how times have changed', which was light-hearted and entertaining. Then she gave a very informative talk on the challenges, both positive and negative on ageing. She explored a range of topics including the benefits of living longer, health challenges, wisdom and experience, financial matters, social isolation and 'ageism.'

As Christians she emphasised speaking with family about spiritual matters such as preparing for your funeral which can lead to precious conversations. She encouraged congregations to promote intergenerational activities and interactions to give opportunities for older members to pass on the faith and strengthen the value and respect of the elderly.

Newly elected Secretary of Lutheran Women of South Australia Chris Kuchel extended greetings from the LWSA-NT Executive Committee and gave details on convention and areas of need on various committees as well as details of the October Retreat to be held at Mt Barker. Ruth Noack, the representative and chairperson of the Lutheran Care and Clothing Committee gave a brief report.

We were sublimely entertained by a musical recital from Charles Klein (oboe) and Joseph Ingram (piano) of 'Three Miniatures' by English composer York Bowen.

The afternoon program was held in Bethlehem House and during lunch there was the opportunity for fellowship and catching up with friends as well as perusing various displays from the Lutheran Tract Mission, Lutheran Media, Lutheran Disability Services and Care Ministry Resources. There was a special historical display of Guild photos to mark the 130th anniversary of the Women's Guild, which was set up by the Archives Committee. A trading table was also held.

After the singing of Hymn 819 'Wake us, oh Lord, to human need', Helen Hassold introduced the afternoon keynote speaker and congregation member Ann Pietsch, speaking on



'Living and Volunteering with Dementia'. Ann gave a deeply moving talk on her journey with dementia giving unique insights into the world of dementia and valuable information and advice on this complex and varied condition. From a background in nursing, particularly in geriatrics, and working as a Manager of Aged

Care Services, Ann found herself at age 59, diagnosed with Lewy Body Dementia. Her Christian approach to this life changing situation is truly inspiring and based on the words of

Jesus from John 15:12 "My command is this: 'Love one another as I have loved you'." Ann aims to be 'Christ-like' and shine in her volunteering as a Dementia Advocate. She currently serves on ten Advisory Committees and Boards helping raise awareness and giving vital practical information on dementia. Just two examples - confusing signage in public places and working with the Ambulance and Fire Departments to help their officers better understand when their work involves dealing with a dementia patient. A dementia friendly church might include special services for the elderly, coffee groups and using hymns that people know well. Little things help like introducing who you are when you are engaging in conversation, being respectful, helping with hymnbooks and service orders. Ann acknowledged the wonderful support of her husband Timothy, one of the 1.5 million carers in Australia currently supporting a person with dementia. Her advice is to be upfront and honest with family as talking and sharing gives a better understanding to those caring for you. Ann lives one day at a time trusting and knowing that "Christ helps me in all that I do."

Following the singing of a 'Seniors' version of Jesus loves me, Grace Bock led an interesting panel discussion on volunteering. She interviewed congregation members Julia Borgas, Elva Mutton and Annette Wessling exploring the different aspects of volunteering based on their wide range of volunteering roles.



The offering for the day totalled \$803.00 and together with the proceeds of the Trading Table, \$500.00 was given to Care Ministries Resources and also to Lutheran Disability Services. Judith Ortlepp and Helen Hassold presented gifts to the guest presenters.

Pastor Stephen Pietsch led the closing devotion and a wonderful day of fellowship concluded with the singing of Hymn 543, 'Abide with me'.

Thanks to all who helped in so many ways to ensure this day was a blessing.

Metropolitan North Zone Rally Day

The Metropolitan North Zone Fellowship Day was hosted by "The Ark", Salisbury Lutheran Church, on Thursday, 17th August, 2023, where 41 guests were welcomed with warming "cuppas" and biscuits.

After President, Annette Wilksch, welcomed all present, Pastor Joel Cramer, in his devotion, introduced our theme based on Psalm 145: "Let each generation tell its children of your mighty acts; let them proclaim your power".



This psalm invites us to praise God, tells us of his character and shows God's glorious kingdom. While we know of this, it is also important to speak and teach this to the next generation. This Psalm reminds us that our stories are important, as others are watching and listening to us. When we tell of God's goodness in our lives, this encourages others who may be struggling.

The morning speaker was Mark Underwood, the Pastoral Care Worker at Lake Windemere School in Salisbury North. We were captivated as he shared with us his personal story of coming to faith, and to his current work situation. Sharing some "treasures" of this journey, he stressed that life's difficulties (the "messiness" of life) actually shape us.

As a Secondary School chaplain in previous schools, he was able to help and counsel students in their spiritual needs by being available, listening and so showing God's love to them. In his current ministry role he deals with many high-needs children and their severely disadvantaged families. Working with Primary students, he seeks ways to be creatively involved in the lives of the students and their families, and is part of the "well-being team" with staff, demonstrating God's love in many ways.

We were amused as he demonstrated fun techniques he uses to teach the children to calm them down and control strong emotions. These involved imaginatively blowing bubbles into a

"milkshake",
smelling a "flower"
and then blowing
out a "candle", in
order to control
breathing and
anxiety!

He also uses small soft toys called "Kimochis" as a means to identify and

understand "big feelings". These toys are available to staff, students and their families too, so that their effectiveness in creating a positive culture goes well beyond the classroom. Another popular ministry tool is "Mark's Multi Media Minions" using video cameras, especially targeting and engaging children with special needs.

Many local needy families have been blessed by his on-site food pantry (especially during COVID), and over 20 Christmas hampers, distributed annually, have been "an answer to prayer", witnessing to the love and support of church members as we share God's love and power.

Mark concluded by encouraging attendees to continue to find many ways themselves to tell others, especially the young, of God's amazing love and power.

Attendees provided their own packed lunches which were supplemented by bread and a choice of three soups. Lunch provided time for socialising, and inspecting displays from the Tract Mission and Blueprint Ministries, as well as the well-stocked trading table.

Immediately after lunch we were delighted by a presentation of songs and musical instruments by children from the adjacent Lutheran Kindergarten. Led by an enthusiastic parent, we were encouraged to join in the singing and actions. This involved much stretching and no chance to nod off after lunch!



Spot speaker, Chris Kuchel, the Secretary of the LWSA-NT, reminded us to "never underestimate your impact on others" in witnessing to God's love and power in our lives. She referred to the strong messages presented at the recent LWSA-NT Convention at Glenelg on the "Storms of life".

A few dates were highlighted:

Susan Richards from "Lutheran Care" used a video to show us the history, services and programs that enable Lutheran Care to make a difference. With the increased cost of living, they are now faced with many emergencies (in fact at 260% increase!). So the donations of food and quality goods are greatly appreciated, as well as the support from government and churches. It was informative to hear some case studies of homelessness and the helpful services available to these people through Lutheran Care. She thanked us very sincerely for our continuing support.

"Blueprint Ministries" was represented by Jeanette Mann, who is the Pastoral Care Worker at the Callington Primary School. She referred to Ephesians 2:10, reminding us that we are all God's blueprint or masterpiece. Therefore we are all committed to sharing this with children and family. The aim of Blueprint Ministries is "that children and young people will know Jesus as their Saviour and grow in him". On the display table were many resources freely available to equip and encourage us in this.

Jeanette outlined the many ministries they offer: camps, seminars, conferences, training and "Facebook" to cover the age range of Primary to young adults. She stressed how important it is to be an intentional Christian grandparent by praying, making time for children, and continuing to share and encourage them.

The hymns sung during the day were:

Pastor Joel concluded our inspiring day with his devotion "Our God is good". He encouraged us to remember the times God has heard our prayers and continues to welcome us with his warmth, grace and forgiveness. His eternal kingdom is our gift, and so we will praise and tell of him all of our days.

During a brief interlude, a song on video explaining our theme entitled "Fruits of the Spirit" was played.

The LWSA-NT President, Josie Hunt's report was read by Chris Kuchel. Reminders were given about up-coming events next year, and an overview of the projects that are supported.

This was followed by lunch, sitting around tables and enjoying fellowship with each other, as well as checking out the stalls which had been set up.



The afternoon's guest speaker was Erin Kerber, LCA International Mission, who gave a comprehensive report on the Care and Counselling Centre in Malaysia. A video outlining the many ways of sharing the love of God and support given there was shown. The example of the Parable of the Sower described ways that change lives and show that God does not

give up on anyone. Through prayer and projects, including the sale of stamps, much is able to be done to support the women in this centre.

Val Mew and Ruth Dean performed a humorous skit called "It's a Banana" which conveyed a possible make-believe conversation between Eve and the snake.

The business part of the day then followed with the various reports from representatives of several of the Zone LWSA-NT committees, including the Nominations Committee, Lutheran Care and Clothing Committee, Tanunda Lutheran Home Board, Tanunda Lutheran Home Ladies Auxiliary, and also the Barossa Zone Coordinator and the Barossa Zone Treasurer. The Barossa Zone consists of 16 Fellowships.

The offering for the day will be shared between the two projects: Lutheran Care and LCA International Mission.

Penny, attended the meeting of the Lutheran Care and Clothing Committee meeting on Monday 16th October. She gave an update of the Blair Athol Op shop and distribution centre. Thanks to the Lutheran people for the donations of good quality and clean goods ready to help those people in need. The Op shops are all doing very well. Emergency relief is always in need of home-ware as well as toiletries and underwear (new) items. It is very helpful to label all donations as this makes it a lot easier for the volunteers to sort. Volunteers are always welcome to join the teams. Even an hour or two a week can be a huge help to keep the shops open for longer times.

At the February 2024 Committee meeting Zone projects will be allocated in the same way as it was done some years ago. Please give your Zone representative some ideas of what projects your Zone would like to consider.



Keep sewing the cloth bags as they are always being used in the shops. Consider making some small cloth bags for packaging jewellery purchases. [For example:

sizes between 4 cm - 6 cm High and 4 cm - 6 cm Wide with a drawstring.]
Larger cloth bags are used for
Emergency Relief when distributing hampers.
Suitable material for bag making is often available at the Op shops and distribution

Good quality donations of NEW items are needed for Christmas Hampers. These items need to be in by the beginning of December so that packing can be completed before the distribution in mid-December.

In the meantime, if you would like to contribute to the cost of shipping you are most welcome to make a donation to LCA



Did you know that?

GOD'S MISSION THROUGH Stamps Lov Mission



* Stamps with nicks and cuts in them (peel and stick stamps) are left on paper. Cut around them with a centimetre of paper all around. These are then sold as is "on the paper".

* Generally, all other Australian stamps can be soaked off the paper. However, stamps on yellow/brown paper should be soaked separately and not too long, as these can colour the stamps if left too long in water.

God has wonderful ways of turning simple gifts into great blessings. The Lutheran Church of Australia's Stamps for Missions project has raised nearly \$506,000! All proceeds are donated to LCA International Mission programs and projects. This is possible due to the dedication of volunteers who collect, clean, package and sell the stamps.

Stamps for Mission was established in 1938 through the efforts of Pastor Ted Koch and Mr Ern Unger. Ern became the first stamp receiver and he did this for the next 65 years, encouraging many others along the way. In 2008 the LCA International Mission (formerly Board for Mission) took over the Stamps for Mission project from the Lutheran Youth of Australia. It is overwhelming to think how much money has been raised from those seemingly worthless used stamps. We thank God for his blessing through this project.
