TRANS WORLD RADIO

Dear Friends.

Thank you for your continuing support which is so valuable in helping to reach many children in Cambodia. 1/3 of their population of Cambodia are children. And they are so keen to receive the saving message of the Gospel.

There have been considerable developments with this ministry during the last 12 months. What's happening?

<u>Teaching the children.</u> That **BIG SUNDAY SCHOOL!** Yes, it's still functioning well.

 2,000 + letters are still being received each month from children who respond after listening to the weekly
 Happy Children's Garden radio messages and each letter is individually replied to. (Photo. Bundles of Reply Letters ready to be sent out to the children in various Provinces).



- With these radio messages reaching all corners of Cambodia only God knows how many children are being reached with the Gospel each week. It is probably not an exaggeration to suggest that through their TWR Listener Groups and the broadcasts around 10,000 children, maybe less, but maybe more. Whichever, that's a lot of children! And the kind support that you, the Lutheran Men of Australia, provide assists this mission to reach so many children, Thank you most sincerely. A BIG Sunday school!
- The number of 'Listener Groups' (Sunday Schools) has grown to 226. (See photo).
- Figures provided by their teachers suggest an average regular attendance of between 20 to 30 children in each group.

The way the children express a heartfelt acceptance of Jesus into their lives when they pen their replies indicates that the messages sent out by the Trans World Radio staff each week aren't just a 'fairy floss' message about a kind and loving Jesus, but **messages which tell of their need for a Saviour** who has died for them and offers a path of salvation through His atoning death and His promise to take them to heaven to join Him for eternity. Many of their replies end with a sincere "Please pray that my father and mother will also accept Jesus into their lives".

Equipping the Teachers. The 'Children's Leaders'

Yes, but with 226 TWR Listener Groups at present, and probably growing, **this** needs a lot of Children's Leaders. Then, of course, there are many more Sunday Schools/children's groups attached to village churches throughout Cambodia which aren't run by TWR. Some of their Leaders are equipped for their task/responsibilities, but many are ill equipped to teach and simply use what basic skills they may have to pass on God's saving message.

<u>Can something be done to help these Teachers?</u> Charia, who led the TWR Children's Ministry Department for 18 years, during last year felt God calling her to branch out from TWR to start a special ministry concentrating on helping to equip Children's Leaders by passing on the extensive knowledge she has gained during those 18 years at TWR to others. The Sponsors down here could see this urgent need and encouraged her to make this move.

Equipping the Teachers. So from the beginning of this year Charia has taken on the role of 'Equipping the Teachers'.

- She is working with Pastor Naro, the Director of Lutheran Hour Ministries, who runs a week- long Lutheran Bible School b-monthly.
- Pastor Daniel Orn of the Lutheran Church Phnom Penh City Church has arranged for Charia to lead a workshop for all the Children's Leaders in the Lutheran Church of Cambodia.
- Charia will over time be training two 'Teacher Coaches' in each Province who can then meet with other Children's Leaders in that Province and pass on skills and ideas which will better equip them to teach their children. Many of these Children's Leaders are very young. (Photo. Leaders in training session).
- She is also working with One Hope, an NGO organisation in Cambodia, with their Children's Leader training program.
- Her special project is preparing '3 Minute Videos' of Christian songs which are already being widely broadcast over Facebook and YouTube with very encouraging responses.
- Teaching children in schools for children from the slums.

<u>Valuable help</u>. So through her 'Equipping the Teachers' program Charia will be helping many hundreds of teachers to be better equipped to pass on the precious message of Jesus to their children. This is so valuable and necessary.

<u>Can you help?</u> Does all this cost extra money? Thank you for your continued prayers and financial support of \$1000-00 to Children's Ministry in Cambodia through the Trans World Radio ministry to the children up there. They live in a predominantly Buddhist country and for them to even show an interest in the Christian faith, let alone saying outright that they want to follow Jesus, creates many difficulties including possibly rejection by family and friends.

They are, in a sense, 'little heroes for the Gospel.' They face persecutions which we need to ask ourselves whether we would be willing to do. Please include all those children in your prayers, asking God to give them the strength of faith to maintain their love for and trust in Jesus.

Your support this year is being used to print another 2,500 Good News Readers. These are the 36 page illustrated booklets in the Kmer language which tells of God's plan of salvation, prepared together with the late Pastor Noel Weiss, so it is based 100% on Lutheran theology.

To date 145,000 have been distributed to children in this Buddhist country, and the demand for more Good News Readers continues. Thank you again for your support making more booklets available for distribution.

Halloween, a trick or a treat?

Halloween has become a major public event in the USA – part of the culture. Chocolate sales for Halloween rival Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Australia, is fast following Uncle Sam's lead, becoming more and more at home with Halloween culture. Halloween now dominates our supermarkets for those weeks before Oct 31.

Is Halloween a trick or a treat?

Of course the real Halloween is a purely pagan festival. It is a Celtic festival celebrating the end of their agricultural year, the end of summer, the end of harvest, the time when the Celtic god Samhain, the lord of death, demands sacrifices. It's the time Samhain sends evil spirits to attack unthankful people. These people try to escape the attack by disguising themselves as evil spirits. There is strong evidence of human sacrifices made at the time. The Druids would gather human sacrifices (treats) from terrified families. Interestingly, the name Halloween (Holy) comes from the Christian attempt to sanitise the celebration. The original Halloween revelers tried to incorporate the celebration of Christian resurrection and All Saints Day to combat the pagan festival. Now it seems the pagans have won the day and Halloween has a whole new meaning.

Easter has similar origins. Easter is the pagan celebration of spring, and life, and estrogen (fertility). Easter has quite successfully been taken over by Christians as our highest Christian celebration – the death and resurrection of Jesus. But the Holy in Halloween has never taken off.

Is Halloween a trick or a treat? I'm sure Christians can celebrate the commercialism of Halloween and not be harmed by the pagan overtones in any way all. In fact the fun and festivity could have a positive influence on the family. I can't say this for those who practice Wicca on this their highest day of celebration. I can't say this for the victims of human sacrifice which reportedly still happen on this day. I can't say this for the trick or treating children who are preyed upon by deviants.

Halloween, in Australia at least, carries no Christian strength, and no triumphant victory over evil – it's just chocolate and fun. But does this make it right?

The two chief tools of the devil are apathy and subtleness. While the average Aussie has no idea about Halloween they are happy to participate fully – who cares? As Christians have not succeeded in Christianising the event (apart from the name) Halloween remains neither Christian or intrinsically evil, and here lies the danger – ambivalence! Peer pressure will drive our kids to participate in Halloween. A simple trick or treat is, knowingly, or not knowingly, a participation in a pagan event. Is this what you want? My suggestion?

Christians should be teaching their children that:

- there is a spiritual world filled with goodness from God and evil from Satan (Eph. 2:1-10);
- life with Jesus Christ has power over darkness (I John 4:4)
- Halloween will continue to blossom in Australia because of our great Aussie apathy – she'll be right! But let's at least be informed and apathetic. As Christians let's at least wrestle with the issue for at least one moment with our witch clad nagging kids before we go "trick or treating".

Naked I come to you for dress...

The Seventies, what a time to be Christian? The Seventeen Seventies that is (1770). The English Christian world was caught up in the theologies of two powerful and clever thinkers – John Calvin and John Wesley.

The Calvinists were caught up in a doctrine of divine election which when boiled down, and over simplified, says that if you are elected by God for salvation then you are bound for heaven and nothing you do will change that course. The down side of this is that if you are not elected you have no hope – some even say that the logical conclusion of this thinking is that if you are not divinely elected then you are divinely not elected, in other words God elects you to damnation.

The Wesleyan controversy was rooted in his style of Armenianism. He taught that one could be right with God by being morally perfect, with great human effort and the help of the Holy Spirit.

In the middle of this battle comes a young man, August Toplady, who could not agree with either of the theological giants and writes a hymn about his own theology, Rock of Ages. Rock of Ages named the number one Christian hymn of all time. In this hymn we hear a theology of grace.

Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to the cross I cling; Naked, come to Thee for dress; Helpless look to Thee for grace; Foul, I to the fountain fly; Wash me, Savior, or I die.

From the theological storm comes a hymn of hope adopted by all Christians. It is the hope we share - salvation is through faith in Jesus alone. August Toplady was not a Lutheran, Calvinist, or a Wesleyan but one who could identify God's grace in a storm.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. Listen to a hymn of Grace these holidays – God watch over you. Pastor David.

What's The World Coming To? By John Seidel.



When I was a young man my father (pictured left) was often heard to say "what's the world coming to?" I was a young bloke and after such a comment I would often think, "don't worry Dad it will all turn out OK'. The younger generation will sort it out. As an example, back in the early 1950s he would go to a hardware store to buy gelignite, detonators and fuse wire, to blow out tree stumps on our farm. Later a government regulation was adopted that in order to buy explosives you had to apply for a permit to purchase. Once you had the permit you only could get it from a depository at Dry Creek. Then the next problem was that you had to

get a permit to transport it, this entailed the following regulation, 'your vehicle had to display a sign front and rear reading "EXPLOSIVES", the signs had to comply with certain dimensions set in the regulation. Then of course you had to have a regulation standard fire extinguisher aboard your vehicle. My father was heard to ask the question, "I have a knapsack, (firefighting type, not to carry school books in) would this be OK!", and so it went on, it was just all getting too hard. In this and in many other matters it became a permit world. Permits to sink a dam or drill a water bore on your farm, multi grade vehicle licences, building permits and so on and on it went. A common phrase was heard a lot in those days, "it won't be long and you will have to get a permit to go to the toilet". It's happened in a roundabout way, just ask your local builder, he can probably fill you in on all the regulations to building a toilet, get my drift? The current generation has become familiar with all of these regulations and probably would be surprised if you didn't have to apply for a permit for most things.

Now I have what I consider to be of a mature age, six years older than my father reached, and I too am bamboozled with modern electronics and technology asking questions and commenting in a similar vein. "What's the world coming to?" just as my father used to ask. My questions and concerns are of course on quite different subjects, a different generation, a different world, mainly relating to legislation that is contrary to Christian teachings and convictions. I too ask, "What's the world coming to?" Australia used to be a Christian nation. Now we have reached a population of 25 million and it seems atheists are ruling the land.


There is a list of things as long as my arm that I could name, and then some, and I'm sure you have a list as well. Abortion on demand, once was reserved for life endangered mothers. You can't rely on politicians not to amend laws to their detriment. There is the LGBT legislation and all that this encompasses, (mind boggling) of course contrary to Christian principals.

Euthanasia is another hot topic, and if you're not a Christian these things seem so valid. It all started in the Garden of Eden. **Satan is the chief of liars**, just as he mislead Adam and Eve in that garden; read Genesis account of creation, * Genesis chapter 1: verse 27-28, 'So God created man in his own image, in the image of God He created him, male and female he created them.' Maybe Satan called a worldwide convention of demons.
