







YOUR PARTNERS IN MISSION

The LCA has a long and valued history with the ministry and mission in PNG. Many of us have a connection in one way or another to people who have served in PNG directly or have supported God's work there in significant ways.

Our in-country partner church is the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea (ELCPNG), which has about 1.2 million baptised followers of Jesus. While this number of Lutherans in our neighbour country is reason for joy and thanks, at the same time the ELCPNG experiences many challenges, and they seek the support of their partner churches.

In particular, the new leaders of the ELCPNG have expressed a desire to focus on the development of the theological capacity of the seminaries and the training of pastors and lay people in theology. Bishop Jack Urame has asked the ELCPNG's overseas partners for assistance by providing resource people and scholarships to support their church in this key area.

The eastern half of the island of New Guinea was divided between Germany (north) and the UK (south) in 1885. The latter area was transferred to Australia in 1902, which occupied the northern portion during World War I and continued to administer the combined areas until independence in 1975. Nearly 40 per cent of the population lives a self-sustainable natural lifestyle with no access to capital. PNG has several thousand separate communities (most with only a few hundred people) divided by language, customs and traditions. Some of these communities have engaged in low-scale tribal conflict with their neighbours for millennia; the advent of modern weapons and migration into urban areas has greatly magnified the impact of this lawlessness.
