Why church?

Do you find yourself asking this question? Don't be surprised if you do, you're certainly not alone. Data from the recent National Church Life Survey (NCLS) tells us that gathering for worship is the most important thing to us, and we value Holy Communion, preaching and worship style.

But why do we gather? Why do we celebrate the Word and Holy Communion? We seem to be stuck with a mindset that being a Christian is mostly about going to church and being spoon-fed. Can this be right?

Do we need to get back to basics and remember who we are in God, listen to what He is calling us to, and be reminded about that 'Great Commission', to make disciples of all nations?

Do we need to think about how we are answering God's call? Can we answer it sitting in a church building? What is the story that we are telling ourselves in our weekly practices? Do we need to repent, that is, to return to God, acknowledge our mistakes, and give them over to Him?

So, who are we?

We are a remnant Church. We no longer operate from a position of power in society. Our strength is Jesus. Through Him, we are here to answer the questions of the world – questions of the decline in mental health, and the loneliness epidemic; questions of belonging and purpose. Churches are not events-based clubs. We are hospitals for the broken, here to provide real Biblical community. The church is a place where people can belong and find meaning, restoration, comfort, and strength in Jesus, through grace alone, and where they can also find acceptance by real people.

What do we need to repent of and return to?

One thing we can repent of is that we have often become self-serving. Another is our fear about getting things wrong and not knowing the right answers. And then there's the fear of the church closing and our wanting to keep the doors open to our local church expression.

What would it look like if we began to educate and equip ourselves to be Church in the world? Reading God's Word and devoting ourselves to prayer. These are learning areas that remind us of the 'why?' that motivates us to be the Church in the world in the first place.

What is God calling us to?

The LCANZ sums up our purpose well in its goal: **Cather. Grow. Go.**

How do we answer God's call?

How do we move towards church communities that will grow in their faith and live a life worthy of the calling that we have received? Growing and going!
