

The Lutheran Women of SA-NT covers many missions and ministries and I would like to thank all the members who stand on our committees and those who represent us on the different groups. There is a small group of ladies who dedicate themselves to arranging the honey biscuit bags and to pack and disperse boxes of biscuits for Christmas cheer. Our retreat committee held a restful retreat weekend themed "Beside still waters" in October at St Mark's, Mount Barker. The speakers, food and fellowship flowed well for the weekend, with many good reports coming in about the event. Thank you to the Retreat committee for your tireless enthusiasm and I know you are on the way to planning the next inspirational event.

It was reported that we had 1071 members for 2023 and I am hoping we can get a big number of you to our 57th Convention on Saturday 18th May at Zion Lutheran Church, Glynde and to the Lutheran Women of Australia's Convention on the 2nd and 3rd of October at Unity College, Murray Bridge. The LWA Convention is the closest national gathering we will have for a few years, so I hope you can make an extra effort to come to Murray Bridge.

Our Treasurers report shows we sent an amazing \$90,396 to the projects of LWSA-NT and LWA and various other projects. You have been able to bless many people through your generosity and I thank God for your faithfulness to answer the call of the needy, the orphan, the widow, the alien, or stranger both overseas and among us. Through your kindness you welcome all into God's family, so they are no longer strangers. How fitting for our theme for the 57th LWSA-NT Convention to be "No Longer

Strangers" — "So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are citizens along with God's people. You are members of God's family." Ephesians 2:19

LWA Presidents Report

Lutheran Women of Australia "Women loved by God, sharing this love with others"



By the grace of God, we have journeyed through another year, coming together for times of bible study, fellowship, worship and in support of one another – in our home fellowships/guilds/groups and then at zone activities and state conventions and retreats – and also our communities. I pray that you have all been encouraged and supported by your attendance and participation.

Executive members were delighted to join with activities across the states throughout the year — Beryl Smith, attending LWNSW & ACT Convention in Jindera; Maureen Turner & Val Schild attending the LWSA-NT Convention at Glenelg; Maureen Turner travelling to Warrnambool to be with LWVic & Tas ladies; Dianne Adams and myself making our way to be with the ladies of LWWA in Geraldton; and my travels by air, via Melbourne to Maroochydore on the Sunshine coast for the LWQ Convention/Retreat. Thank you to all of the organising committees for each of these special days/weekends.

The mid-term meeting of the LWA Council was held in North Adelaide on the 26th and 27th July, 2023 at the Lutheran Laypeoples League, and our executive members and Counsellors were pleased to welcome two representatives from each state. Pastor John Gerhardy and Pastor Paul Fielke presented the opening and closing devotions, and provided valuable support to our discussions over the two days which saw us complete an update of the Constitution, and hear from representatives of various LWA Projects, and meet some of the officials from LCA National Office. Attention to financial matters, enabled the distribution of accumulated funds (totalling \$60,000) to various projects, the full details being provided in the October/November issue of the *Lutheran* Women Magazine.

\$10,000 from the Pastoral Ministry Students Assistance Fund has also been given to support the work of Pastor Julian Mazzeo, recently ordained as Pastor to the Adelaide Deaf Community Church whose worship base is Pilgrim Lutheran Church, Magill, SA.

Accumulated Funds in the ALC Pastoral Ministry Students Assistance Fund are invested in Term Deposits with the LLL. With only a small number of students, call for assistance has been minimal. There is presently in excess of \$50,000 in this fund and we suggest that at this time, you may like to choose to direct your financial support to some of the other listed projects. The ALC Women's Auxiliary has chosen to go into recess while the review of the Lutheran church properties in North Adelaide continues. Only two units have been occupied by ALC student families, with all other units being commercially let and some also sold. So this project also requires minimal support at this time.

Through the pages of the *Lutheran Women* Magazine, we have been kept informed of activities in the mission fields of South-East Asia and Papua New Guinea, which have continued through the generous support of you all throughout the year. Our treasurer Beryl Smith has advised that at 31st December, 2023 we have 2316 members, and a total of \$93,661.26 was distributed during 2023 to the LWA nominated projects. Thank you for your generous 'mission hearts'.

Upon the invitation of Erin Kerber, from LCA International Mission, several of our executive members have been able to meet with representatives from projects supported in Indonesia and Malaysia. These representatives have extended their thanks for support given, and told us about further work in their respective churches.

We are indeed very blessed to be the recipients of a wonderful magazine for our organisation. Many thanks to the team of Grace Bock, Felicity Evans and Maureen Turner, who put together a most informative and encouraging publication, with the Devotions and Bible Studies lovingly prepared for us and especially appreciated when and where there are pastoral vacancies. Thank you to Dee Simons for the devotions, and Pastor Peter Klemm, Sal Huckel and Anne Hansen for the studies on the "Fruits of the Spirit". Many hours are given by the editorial team – all voluntary – to provide this magazine. Thank you also to the groups who share of their activities via the State Link pages. Last year you were made aware of increasing costs – especially postage - which necessitated a rise in the subscription cost. Thank you for your renewals, and please encourage on-going subscriptions or consider gifting a subscription.

The plans for the LWA Convention in Murray Bridge SA on 2nd and 3rd October are progressing well and you will be kept informed

via the *Lutheran Women* Magazine, together with news from executive members attending your conventions/retreats. In anticipation I thank newsletter editors in our states for also providing convention information. Registrations will be available on-line and paper registration forms will be available upon request. I look forward to seeing many of you at Murray Bridge, when you will hear from an array of guest speakers who will acknowledge our chosen theme of 'How great thou art' in their addresses to convention.

I thank you for your prayers and words of encouragement. I thank God for the faithful service of those who have been called to their heavenly home during this past year and pray that you are all given time and good health to serve as sisters in Christ for yet another year in his earthly kingdom.

Retreat Committee

I thank God for the wonderful tone present among participants at our last retreat, which was held in Mt Barker in October 2023. The St Mark's congregation hosted us in fine style, accommodating all our needs, and producing amazing, tasty meals. It seemed people were glad to be there, and to have fellowship with each other. The retreat theme was 'Beside Still Waters'. Our chaplain Karen Pietsch led us in several quiet times – a true 'retreat' from the day-to-day world of busy activity in which most of us are usually engaged. Spending so much time in reflection was a challenge for some, but ultimately of benefit to all.

Other speakers told us of their involvement with various ministries. Emma Graetz gave information on all the variety of courses and programs being offered at Australian Lutheran College. Andy Traeger opened our eyes to the challenges of chaplaincy in our Lutheran secondary schools. Pastor David Christian spoke passionately about the faithful few Christian believers in Vietnam. (He is one of the Australian pastors who have gone to teach Vietnamese pastors and lay workers.)

Sing-alongs were appreciated, with fantastic accompaniment on the organ and piano. Saturday evening was a relaxed time of entertainment, mixing people up with ones they may not know, and having a lot of laughs.

I thank the committee members who made this all run smoothly. As a committee we farewell Margaret Reimann and Joy Becker, who have served their term on the committee so well. God bless you for your faithfulness, and give you the energy to serve in some capacity elsewhere. By the way, we are searching for a Treasurer to come onto our committee. The work is not year-round, and there is help available for orientation into the role.

Your retreat committee has met a couple of times since the Mt Barker retreat. When we looked at this year's calendar of events, and at the feedback given after the last retreat, we decided it would be better to return to the original timeslot for retreats – in January. Instead of retreating in spring, we would encourage all women to take the opportunity to attend the Australia-wide LWA Convention in Murray Bridge at the start of October. Having the event in SA is a bonus for us. Plan to take a younger woman with you, to be able to participate in the inspiring program being prepared by the LWA executive.

We are planning a live-in 2-day, 2-night retreat at Nunyara, a conference centre at Belair. As it is cheaper on weekdays, and with a view to freeing up women for their frequent

duties at their home congregations on Sundays, we have chosen Wednesday 8th January to Friday 10th January. All meals are included, but participants bring their own bed linen and towel, etc. (as we used to do at ALC.) There will be the opportunity to attend just on the Thursday, for those who live near enough, and who cannot commit to the full retreat.

Start to think of a woman you can invite to come along, to experience a retreat for the first time. Pray for her. The Retreat promises to be a valuable time of fellowship and learning.

Another urgent request is for cloth bags for use at shops and for emergency food hampers. See pages 15-16 for more information.

gratitude goes to those who enabled and made this happen. For the last couple of years the Auxiliary has also taken on mending for the residents and this involves 2-3 hours every 3-4 months in the Protea area. This has been rewarding, as it not only helps residents, but also allows time for talking with them. Thanks to the staff for assisting with the setting up of machines and notifying residents when mending will happen.

Another casualty of COVID is the annual Strawberry fete, and this had meant no fund raising since 2019. Therefore any donations from guilds and fellowships are very much appreciated. The LWSA-NT was very generous towards Aged Care and the Auxiliary received \$3,007.00 during 2023. With this and including donations from various fellowships, the Auxiliary was able to purchase an outdoor

setting for \$2,450.91 for the home. This has been well received, as it is in an enclosed area where residents can have a number of visitors at one



time in the outside area.

The Auxiliary currently holds a balance of \$2,098.96 and this will allow us to spend about \$1,500.00 on the "wish list" still to be supplied by TLH.

The Auxiliary was saddened by the death of one of its members, Hedy Stanley, during 2023, but has welcomed Lyn Albrecht as a new member. Helen Fiebiger has retired from the Auxiliary and thanks are extended to her for many years of service. It is the prayer of the Auxiliary that it can continue to be of assistance to the residents of the home.

The Theme for 2023 was "I have heard about your faith". It was prepared by the WDP committee of Taiwan.






Wow, what a great weekend when 29 Ladies and Pastor David Kent arrived at Tarooki Camp on Friday afternoon, 24th February 2023.

The weekend kicked off with pizzas, pavlova and cheesecake followed by games and fellowship in the evening.



On Saturday we were joined by

another 15 ladies and the Bible studies led by Pastor David began. The weekend theme was "Commit your way to the Lord" based on Psalm 37:5. The first study gave us an insight into the various interpretations and understanding of the bible using ancient languages. The question is: Do we see it literally, contextually, or both? The answer is to always look at all areas of the Scriptures to increase understanding. Pastor David then considered the many complexities of the Greek language which are foreign to us but are used in the Bible.

In the second study Pastor David provided two different translations of Psalm 37 and explored the variations in a few verses and the applications to our lives. We lingered on the first part of verse 7: "Be still before the Lord". The final verses of the Psalm reassure us of God's continual grace, no matter what wickedness may be faced in the world.

The third study explored the deeper meaning of verse 5 by understanding the historical language used in the various interpretations, and relevant passages aligned with this verse. The second part of verse 5 says "trust in him and he will do this". In truth, Jesus died to demonstrate that point by dying in that trust and faith in his Father. As a result, he was raised from death to eternal life. All we have to do is trust, the rest has been done for us.

Conclusion: The wisdom of Psalm 37 is intended to reassure the reader of God's embracing and continual grace through life's journey. No matter what wickedness the world might bring upon us or how successful the wicked may appear to become, God's eternal love will overcome our worries, anxieties and bring us his everlasting peace.

In between the studies we were given a short book review by Sue Zwar on Francine River's book "A Lineage of Grace" in which she detailed the stories of 5 women of the Bible.

Kay Braendler gave a short talk promoting the "The John Drama" being presented at the Naracoorte town hall on Saturday 24th March and Sunday 25th March by Wycliffe Bible Translators and local performers.

Urgent request:



Keep sewing the cloth bags as they are always being used in the shops. Larger cloth bags are used for distributing hampers for Emergency Relief and at the Op Shops. Suitable material can be obtained from the sorting area at Blair Athol.



The ideal size for larger bags is 53 cm (21 in) long x 46 cm (18 in) wide with 46 cm (18 in) length handles sewn on similar to a shopping

bag. Emergency relief bags need to be made in a similar size, but from stronger material as food parcels are heavier. Sew the corners to make a box shape at the bottom of the bag.

Consider also making some small cloth bags for the use of putting jewellery purchases in them. [For example: sizes between 9 cm - 12 cm High and 7 cm - 10 cm Wide with a drawstring.]



Material bags need not be new material it can be good, clean recycled material. Keep sewing and may God continue to bless your work. Thank you all for your support and contributions.
