# Seasons of the church year


Most people are aware of the four seasons of winter, spring, summer and autumn. But did you know that the church has seasons also? The church year (also called the liturgical year) is the annual cycle of seasons and days observed in Christian churches.

The best place to begin understanding the seasons is with Jesus. The Church's seasons largely follow the major events of his life: his birth, ministry, death, resurrection, and ascension. Christmas and Easter are the most recognised and foundational celebrations. These two seasons have a season of preparation before them. Advent prepares for the coming of Jesus Christ. It ends with Christmas, with the birth of Jesus. The season of Lent is the preparation season for Easter. Lent reflects on the suffering that Jesus endured during his death on the cross.

Each season also has colours dedicated to it. The basic colours used the most are green (a symbol of growth), purple (a symbol of Jesus' royalty), white (a symbol of purity) and red (a symbol of power).
