### Steps to get started

#### Form a team

When forming a team make a list of the possible roles required, then think about the skills you require to fill those roles and make your event successful. Also make sure they have a passion for your cause!

### Decide on your event

You might like to choose a larger event like a quiz night or run a series of small fundraising activities throughout the year but whatever your event make sure you consider the demographic of the people who are participating and which venues are available for you to use. It is always great to use the church hall but have you thought about partnering with a local business (is the local coffee shop big enough?!) and ask whether they'd be prepared to 'host' the event for you. The local business could benefit from any sales.

### Don't forget the important stuff!

- Do an event risk assessment
- Make sure you have an authority to fund raise
- Prepare a budget
- How are you going to receive payment and donations?
- Do you need insurance?
- Check state and territory legislation and local government regulations to see if your event needs a permit, licence or to be registered

### Helpful Stuff

### Promote your event

As far as getting the message out there is concerned, you cannot over communicate. Use social media, posters, word of mouth, an ad in the local newspaper, a notice on the community notice board, and the church bulletin. Produce postcards or flyers and do letterbox drops. Most importantly encourage members of your congregation to personally invite friends and neighbours and anyone in the broader community. The posters and advertising is important to keep the event before people's eyes, but it is the personal invitation that's most effective.

### Social media tips

Using your social media accounts is a great way to spread the word about your fundraiser especially amongst your family and friends. It gives you the chance to tell a story in a very visual and meaningful way. Here are a few tips to get you started:

- Use images that are eye-catching, relevant and fun.
- Make sure your message is direct and to the point.
- Timing is everything, so think about your audience and when they would be most likely to read your post.
- Use a hashtag that reflects your motivations and already exists. For example: #ChurchPlanting #YourChurchName
- Let us know of your event so we can help you promote it through our New and Renewing Facebook page and website.

### More Helpful Stuff

### Tips to boost your fundraising

- Set a target! Aiming high can be a great motivator for you and your supporters.
- Add an email signature to the bottom of your emails with link or details of how to find out more about your fundraiser.
- Ask your local businesses about donating venues, prizes and services. You will be surprised how generous they can be if you just ask!
- When you catch up with friends or family members, make a point to talk to them about your fundraiser in person. You could even have a flyer ready to give them further information.
- Sharing on social media is great but don't forget an email or text makes it more personal. When sending an email or text, take the time to address the person individually by name and include a little bit about why you think they'll want to support or attend your event.
- The time spent personalising each message will be rewarded with more support.
- Make sure you let people know if they can't attend your event that they can still donate to your cause. So make it easy and let them know how they can donate.
- Form a data base of names and contact details of those who attended your event so you can invite them to your next event.

### **Collecting Donations**

### Make it easy

Make it easy and try to have a solution for cash, cheque and online.

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or an online donation solution is the best way to make your life easier as all online donations come straight through to your bank and then you can post or email a tax receipt.

Third party fundraising websites can offer you your own fundraising webpage where people can make donations and they will automatically receive a receipt. The donation will also be added to your fundraising target so you can keep track of your progress. When researching this option, we suggest you start with GoFundraise.com.au

Also remember you will need to provide a receipt for any purchase or donation.





### Thank your supporters

Don't forget to thank your supporters because without them you couldn't achieve your goal!

The ways you can thank your supporters are endless:

- Send them a personal SMS or email showing your appreciation for their donation.
- Post on your social feeds about generous supporters to make them feel special.
- Tag a business to recognise their support.
- Create a list of people to thank at your event and read out their names in front of your attendees.
- Create a thank you certificate and send them to those special individuals who helped you reach your goal.

### Checklist



### On the day

- Signage and any displays in place.
- Check audio visual and sound are working and ready to go.
- Seating is in place.
- Catering has arrived.
- Have facilities in place to take donations
- Just before people arrive make sure you do a walk of the venue to ensure there are no risk hazards.
- Ensure you have a running sheet prepared with anything you need to announce during the event.
- Do a last minute check and make sure everything is ready to go and then don't forget to have fun!

#### Post event

- Clean up
- Thank all your participants
- Bank funds raised into your nominated account
- Don't forget to share the success of your event on social media etc.
- Keep your supporters informed of how their donation is making a difference.
